

## SORRY DAY

On Friday 24<sup>th</sup> May, Wollumbin High School celebrated National Sorry Day. This is an annual day of commemoration and remembrance of all those who have been impacted by the government policies of forcible removal that have resulted in the Stolen Generations.

The annual Sorry Day commemorations have helped to remind and raise awareness about the significance of the forcible removal policies and the impact that they have had not just on the children that were taken, but also on their families and communities. The commemoration of National Sorry Day each year helps contribute towards a broader ongoing effort toward healing and social and emotional wellbeing for individuals, families and communities across the country.

Our hope is that one day soon, dates of significance with regard to the Stolen Generations - National Sorry Day and the Anniversary of the Apology - will be held in as high esteem as other national days of remembrance such as ANZAC Day. This will ultimately help to achieve a broader level of recognition across Australian society of the suffering and trauma experienced by the Stolen Generations and by Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander families and communities across the country.

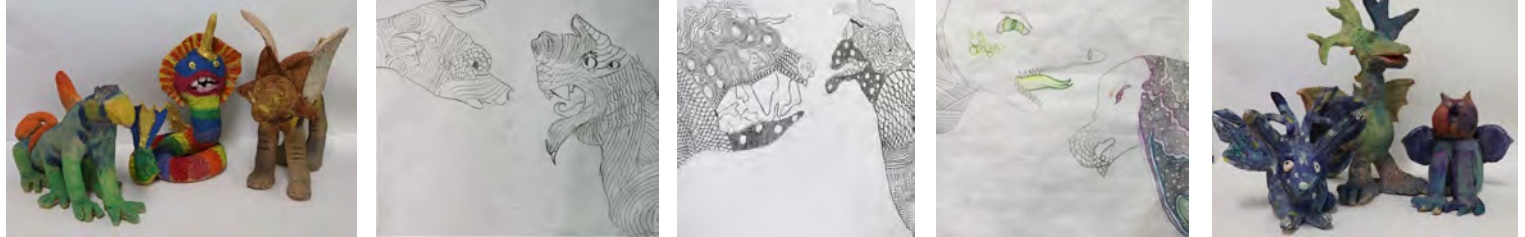
