### TERM 2

We welcome Mr Guy Wright, who will be relieving as Principal for the remainder of the year. Mr Wright is an experienced Principal who is looking forward to joining our Wollumbin community.

# Term 2 commences as usual with a School Development Day on Monday 27<sup>th</sup> April, which is student free.

Term 2 will then continue with students being involved in Learning from Home delivery. The Department of Education anticipates this being for most, if not all, of Term 2.

We ask all parents who are able to care for their children at home to please do so. Schools are classified as essential services and as such will remain open to help other essential service workers.

### The canteen will not be open during Term 2.

Google classroom and physical packages will continue as our mode of delivery. On-line learning has been a big adjustment for all of us – students, staff and parents. We anticipate the intensity of information you have been receiving the past few weeks will reduce as we settle into a routine.

The Learning Activities provided at the end of Term 1 will be due for submission on 1<sup>st</sup> May, for all students, unless the classroom teacher has identified otherwise in their instructions to students. Our preference is that students persevere with Google Classroom as their learning mode. If your student needs a loan laptop to support their learning please phone the school as we are working with our parents to support as many students as possible.

If you wish to move your student to physical packages (after they have tried to give online learning a serious try) please contact the school to discuss. We now have our list of students for whom packages will be supplied. Printing of packages is completed the Tuesday, prior to distribution, and hence requests for any new student additions to physical package compilation must be no later than the Monday prior to printing. e.g package distribution would be available on Wednesday 29<sup>th</sup> April - printing will be on Tuesday 28<sup>th</sup> April - request for new student inclusion on package list would have to be no later than Monday 27<sup>th</sup> April.

The provision of learning units will cycle on a fortnightly basis until further notice (see the table below). It will be important the office staff know whether they need to post packages home or you will collect. We are allowing time for this to occur in our organisation processes but delay in collecting packages does not extend the due date for students. Date on posted packages should reflect the expected due date for return if not being dropped into school.

Phone calls and contact by staff has commenced. If 'private number' comes up on your phone it is likely a staff member calling you on their personal phone as our school lines have been in overload.

As parent updates are mostly by email it is important we know how to provide information to you if you cannot access emails at home. Is there someone who can share the information with you via their email address? Please let the school know if you haven't already done so. If we post an update, it could be well out of date before you receive the information.

We hope the resources enclosed in the package you have received with this Talkabout provide valuable information for you and your children.

Thank you for your ongoing support. We will continue to keep you updated as the need arises.
